**Please comment on SWOC Analysis:(250 Words)**

**Strength:** Strength of the institute is its teachers who are in constant touch with research-works and publications. They are keen to organise periodic lectures, seminars, workshops. Infrastructural facilities starting from modern class rooms, computer centres, laboratories and digital library are available. The Principal and the administration team are always conscious regarding the availability of amenities within the institute starting from free internet facilities within campus, advanced reading room, book lending, games and sports facilities to well decorated auditorium as well as cafeteria and beautiful gardens.

**Weakness:** Most of the students belong to the first generation learner's strata and outrage of abject poverty persists in those sections of the society. Male students feel compelled to migrate outside in search of jobs. This results in dropouts from the college. The transport system is also not too developed within the remote areas. Therefore, attending classes till late evening become risky especially for the female students.

**Opportunities:** College is planning to offer various certificate and add on courses which are expected to raise employability of the students. The local industry-academic connection can help the students to do summer internship. These are the attainable opportunities that the students of the college can explore. The college has no infrastructure bottleneck within the campus which is a real opportunity for all the students in such an area.

**Challenges:** Challenges of the college is to bring the students within the ambit of academic ambience and sustain them till the end of the course. Despite experiencing abject of poverty many of the students have secured good scores and have succeeded in real life. The

challenge of the college is to retain the students and help them all to complete the courses with success and make them ready for entry in services or other livelihood in lives.

**Best Practice (s) /Innovations of the Institute:**

**Best Practice I :**

**Title: Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in Education**

**Objectives:** To construct, analyze the better method of learning and inaugurate a digital and Information and Communicative Technology (ICT) based teaching. To allow e-learning or online learning for students and faculty members. To make teaching and learning more interactive, attractive and collaborative. To provide uninterrupted education even during the hard time as well.

**The Context:** During the year 2020-21, the whole world was awfully affected by Covid-19 pandemic. Due to this pandemic, education sector was adversely affected. So ICT has become an intrinsic part of the teaching-learning process. Digitalization of the education system is a great transition of teaching and learning resources of the 21st century. In conformity with this effective use of technology has made the class at Raiganj Surendranath Mahavidyalaya more dynamic, thereby paving the way for the emergence of the motivated students' inquisitiveness and the renewed teachers' enthusiasm as they have been in a process to acquainted with new skills and technologies.

This new environment also involves a change in the roles of both teachers and learners. The new role of teachers demands a new way of thinking and understanding of the new vision of the learning process. Learners will have more responsibilities for their learning as they seek out, find, synthesize, and share their knowledge with others. ICT provides powerful tools to support the shift from the teacher-centered paradigm to the learner-centered one, thereby being instrumental to the emergence of new roles of teacher, learner, curricula and media.

**The Practice:** Shifting the emphasis from teaching to learning creates a more interactive and engaging learning environment for both the teachers and the learners. Some classrooms in the institute have shot throw projectors and few have smart boards. Almost all the faculty members teach the students by using the same. The whole campus has Wi-Fi connection. During the pandemic, most of the



subject teachers extensively used Cloud Classrooms through the college website and Google Meet platform for teaching lessons of their subjects. Sessions were continued on the online platform from remote places wherein all the participants were attending in the class from various locations. Even evaluations were conducted on the online platform. The assessment - process was executed with the use of digital devices to assist in the construction, delivery, storage, or reporting of student-assessment-tasks, responses, grades, or feedbacks. Subsequently it has become our Best Practice and the college has preferred to teach the students even in blended mode.

**Impact of the Practice:**

**Impact on the students:** Students have started learning from online resources also. Students can meet teachers as well as classmates or batch mates online and get the required subject knowledge. Now students can learn anytime and from any place.

**Impact on the faculty members:** Faculty members have started doing various certification programs run by famous universities to learn various skills and to update subject knowledge. Faculty members have participated in various in-service training programs and workshops which are essential for their professional development. Faculty members have started guiding students more rigorously about the learning materials available on the internet, e-books, e-journals, e-magazines, and social sites which are helpful to students to gain subject knowledge.

**Evidence of Success:** With the help of ICT during this time the institute could complete the syllabus, evaluation, and assessment of students. Various co-curricular activities were also organized on the virtual platform. During this pandemic, students always conveyed their fondness for learning through ICT tools.

**Problems encountered:** All of the students and faculty members may not be comfortable using ICT in the Teaching-Learning process due to various reasons i.e., Technology illiteracy, unwillingness to move out of comfort zone, etc. Uninterrupted internet connection is a great challenge. Moreover, ensuring it at the student's end is challenging further. Initially, it was hard to change students' perceived cycle of education. But eventually, they got adopted to use ICT in the Teaching Learning Process.

**Best Practice 2:**

**Title: Teaching- Learning Process.**

**Objectives:** Teaching is a conscious process. The progress of teaching and that of learning are interrelated in such a way that learners toil for their goals and they earn new knowledge, behaviours, and soft skills so as to enrich their learning experiences.

**Context:** While designing the teaching-learning ways, the institution puts emphasis on special needs, learning style, problem-solving approach, interactive learning method, possibility of new curriculum, learning strategy for the sake of students' personal achievement.

**The practice:** Learning includes both formal and informal experiences. In the case of formal learning, the goals are defined by the instructor. Different forms of informal learning are self-study, article-magazine reading, participation in cultural activities, etc. The main limitation of this process is that there is a difference between the teacher-made materials and the commercial materials.

**Evidence of success:** As a result of the teaching-learning process, the students score good marks on exams and different co-curricular activities. Also, it can bring changes in professional practice. The demonstration method of teaching increases the confidence level of the students that help their future buildup.

**Problems encountered:** Scarcity of motivation among the students and poor attendance of the same are the major problems encountered during the teaching-learning process.


**Notes:** Students are mostly benefited from interactive teaching-learning process where both teacher and student participate strongly. Pedagogical methods are also useful since there is a strong interaction between Teacher-Student-Learning environments. The demonstration method helps to grow interest among the learners. In general, different teaching-learning methods not only help the students to increase their academic activities but also make them responsible and active citizens.

#### **Future Plans of the Institute: (250Words)**

1. **Installation of solar panel in our campus:** The college believes in sustainable development. Therefore, in order to reduce the use of non-renewable resources the college has already installed a grid connected 5KW solar panel under RUSA 2.0 scheme in the campus and the college has also a plan to expand the same in near future to combat environmental pollution.
2. **International seminar in various departments:** International seminar helps the students and teachers to broaden their vision and attain global vision. It helps the institute to get a recognition too. Therefore, the college plans to promote more and more international seminars from various departments.



3. **Making more greenery in our campus:** Clean and Green are the two major mottos of Raiganj Surendranath Mahavidyalaya. To raise the sustainability and make the environment eco-friendlier, the College plans to make the campus greener and cleaner.
4. **Encourage faculty members to take part in research:** The college has a long run goal to make the institute a center for potential excellence. Therefore, the college authority wants to make a research hub by encouraging faculty members to pursue path-breaking research work.

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## PREFACE

Raiganj Surendranath Mahavidyalaya was established in 1986 with the intention of meeting the educational needs of rural and suburban youth in the surrounding area. The land of the College was donated by Mr. Shailendra Narayan Sen in loving memory of his father Surendranath Sen and hence the College was named as Raiganj Surendranath Mahavidyalaya. Although initially planned as a Women's College, it later evolved into a coeducational undergraduate degree college affiliated under the University of North Bengal. In 2008, the college became affiliated with the University of Gour Banga. It is currently the largest college in the district, with a student population exceeding 5000. In 2016, the college received accreditation from NAAC at the B+ level. The college now offers four-year Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) programs under the New Education Policy of 2000. Situated in the northern part of Raiganj town, the campus features a modern three-storied building with top-notch facilities that has the purpose of making the process of both teaching and learning an enjoyable and an efficient affair. Being one of its kind in its vicinity, the college has shown significant dedication in enhancing academic excellence in the region with active participation and unquestioned commitment of its administrative, teaching and non-teaching staff.

The team also interacted with the functioning bodies and stakeholders of the college. The period of audit was 2022-23.

The audit was conducted on 25<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2023 and the report was submitted on 10<sup>TH</sup> JUNE 2023.

## **AUDIT DEFINITION:**





**AUDIT PROCESS:**



- The college conducts 7 Add-On/Value-Added Certificate courses.
- The college strictly adheres to the Academic Calendar which is uploaded in the college website.
- Many teachers of the college are involved in setting of question papers for UG programs of the affiliating university.
- Faculty members actively participate in the evaluation and assessment process of the affiliating university.
- Faculty members of the college are also involved in design and development of curriculum for certificate and add-on courses conducted by the college.
- College has organized various seminars, orientation programs, workshops, counseling sessions on values and ethics. It has also organized programs on gender sensitization, environment, sustainability matters etc.
- A number of outreach programs, beyond-campus activities, extension activities are organized by the institutions to incorporate relevant social and ethical values in the curriculum.
- A large number of students have undertaken project work/field work during the year.
- The college has a Computer Centre jointly run by WEBEL which provides training to the students. It imparts hands-on computer training to majority of the students of the college.
- The college has Digital Library developed under RUSA 2.0 Scheme for the use of students and faculty members.
- The institution obtains feedback from the students, teachers and alumni on the curricular and other related aspects of the college.
- Feedback is collected, analyzed and appropriate action is taken. They are made available on the college website.

**RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- NEP- oriented study materials made available to the students.
- Workshops organized for raising awareness among students on the National Education Policy 2020.
- More skill-based add-on/value-added courses introduced for students in line with the NEP.
- The feedback system has been regularized.
- The college website contains detailed information regarding curriculum, routine, academic calendar, various events, etc.

## **CRITERIA II: TEACHING LEARNING AND EVALUATION**

### **OBSERVATIONS:**

- Number of students admitted during the year is 2072 and number of sanctioned seats during this year is 2844.
- There are currently 4808 students out of which 2122 are boys and 2686 number of students are girls. The ratio between boys and girls is nearly 4:5, which shows that our institute plays a pivotal role in establishing women's education and empowerment in the area. It has been observed that the percentage of female students, which is currently 56%, has gradually increased for the last 5 years and has now crossed the number of boys to a remarkable number.
- There are currently 1996 students who belong to Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe (42% of total students) and 1281 no of students in the college who belong to Other Backward Caste (A & B) (27%).
- Thus, in gross, there are around 69% students who belong to socially challenged category. It shows that the college is fully aligned towards its mission and vision of educating the village people for the overall growth of the nation in wider spectrum.
- It has been found that 3912 no. of students are getting Scholarships from different from the State and Central Government Schemes. Thus 81% of students are studying with scholarships which is appreciable.
- The Student to Full-time teachers' ratio is 229:1 approximately.
- The institute conducts seminars, class tests, workshops, debate, orientation program, webinars, project work etc. for enhancing the learning experience of the students.
- ICT tools like Google Classroom, Google Meet, PPTs, WhatsApp etc., are used to make the teaching learning process effective.
- Almost 80% of the sanctioned posts are filled by full-time teachers.
- The institution has 21 full time teachers. There are 14 faculty members who are PhD degree holders. During this year, two faculty members have been awarded PhD degree. Three teachers are pursuing PhD program at present.
- The students are provided with Academic Calendar, List of Holidays, Schedules of Internal Examinations and other important information of the college through the college website and prospectus.
- The admission of the students is done through Online mode. The admissions of students are done on the basis of merit.
- The internal assessment of students is done through a continuous evaluation process of MCQ tests, Tutorials/Assignments, Viva Voce, Project works
- The question papers of the internal examinations are set by departmental teachers as per university guidelines
- The results of the internal examinations are declared within the stipulated time. Any grievances relating to internal examination from the students are efficiently dealt with.



- The teachers and the students of the institution are aware of the Course Outcome (CO) and programme outcome (PO) and Programme Specific Outcome (PSO) offered by the institution.
- The course outcome and programme outcome are mapping through CO- PO mappings
- Proper Attainment towards CO Attainment, PO Attainment are calculated.
- A total of 1095 students appeared in the final semester exam for the session 2021-2022 and all of them have successfully passed. Thus, a 100% pass percentage in the University Examination during the year was achieved.
- The institution regularly conducts surveys of student's satisfaction regarding teaching learning process through feedbacks
- The college publishes a detailed prospectus every year.
- Various FDPs, Webinars and Workshops were organized to equip the teachers with ICT Methodologies of teaching.
- The induction Program for the 1st year is organized by the institution to introduce the newly admitted students to all. In this program, the Vision and Mission and code of ethics of the college is made available to make them aware of the important statements.
- The students are informed about various scholarships, stipends and other useful facilities like student credit card etc. under Government and non- government, that are available to them which help the financially weaker students to avail financial help and continue their studies.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- The college should lay more emphasis on the continuous evaluation process of the students.
- More teachers need to be recruited.
- More parent-teachers' meetings should be organized by the institution to discuss the academic progress and holistic development of the students.
- The Target for CO attainment should be increased gradually
- The students should be made aware of COs, POs and PSOs during orientation program and through some workshops.

### CRITERIA III: RESEARCH, CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION

#### OBSERVATIONS

- 12 teachers have published research papers which are UGC CARE
- Approximately, 40 papers were published by the teachers of the college in various journals during the year.
- More than 15 seminars, webinars and workshops and alike events were conducted by the institution during the year.
- Total number of full-time teachers in the College including the Principal of the College is 23.
- 25 book chapters were contributed by 09 teachers.
- The institution had more than 10 collaborations / linkages for faculty exchange, student exchange, internships, field trips, on-the-job training, research etc., during the year.
- • More than 500 students participated in extension activities conducted with industries, community and non- govt. organization through NSS units of the college during the year.
- More than 10 outreach and extension programs were conducted by the institution during the year.
- During the year 2 awards and recognitions were received by the institution.
- The institution carried out a number of extension activities in the neighborhood community. It also organized extension activities in sensitizing students on social issues in order to bring about their holistic development.
- Webinars, Seminars, Workshops, Extension Programs, beyond- campus activities were organized by the institution to create an environment for innovation, creation of knowledge, as well as transfer of knowledge.
- Few faculty members of the college are involved as co-supervisor for pursuing Ph.D degree to the SACT of our college. Head of the institution (HOI) is continuously encouraging to all the faculty members for active involvement in research work.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Some potential students who have already passed out should be brought into research work under the supervision of some teachers who are have better research credentials.
- All faculty members should get involved in carrying out research activities and publish papers in referred journals.
- More Research Oriented activities should be undertaken by the faculty.
- More collaborative activities for research should be initiated.
- Mobilization of Research Fund from various Govt. and Non- Govt. agencies should be encouraged
- The Incubation center should be more vibrant

It has been observed that the percentage of girl students which is currently 53% has got a gradual increase for last 5 years and has now crossed the no. of boys to a remarkable number.
- There are currently 4,808 students who belong to Socially backward class including SC, ST AND OBC.
- Thus, in gross, there is around 82% student who belong to either economically backward or socially challenged category. It reflects that the college is committed to fulfilling its mission and vision of teaching the community for the larger development of the country as a whole and that 3,912 number of students is getting Scholarships from different State and Central Government agencies.
- The Student to Full-time teachers' ratio is 56:1 approximately.
- The institution has conducted seminars, webinars, workshops, awareness programs certificate courses, counselling, motivational workshops, value-added courses, add-on workshops etc. to improve soft-skills, language and communication skills, life skills and ICT and computing skills of the students
- There is a process of submission of students' grievances in online and offline mode.
- The institution has various committees and cells like Anti Ragging Cell, Minority Cell, SC/ST Cell, Grievances Redressed Cell, ICC to work for effective and timely redressal of students' grievances including sexual harassment and ragging cases.
- 5 outgoing students of the institution have got placement during the year and 325 students have progressed the year to higher education
- 5 students have received awards Medals for outstanding performances in sports/cultural activities at University / State / National /International Level during the year.
- More than 300 students participated in sports and cultural levels during the year.
- The institution has a registered Alumni Association which proactively contributes towards the progress of the institution.
- All current college students can pay their individual college tuition fees through the online banking system. This is very helpful for the students to avoid long queues in front of the college cash counter. It is user-friendly and college fees can be paid from home or any other place at any time.



- The non-teaching staff of the college extends cooperation to the students with regard to admission, registration, examinations, and various government and non-government scholarships and stipends.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- More initiative should be taken by the career counselling cell in providing placement opportunities to the students passing out from the college.
- Monitoring of students' progression on regular basis is necessary.
- Internet Bandwidth should be increased with possible implementation of 1:1 leased line for internet
- The fees payment process through the QR code and UPI and internet bankings should be easier and smooth for the students.

- The governance of the institution is done keeping the mission and vision of the college in perspective.
- The college has a mechanism for delegating authority and providing operational autonomy to various functionaries, thus bringing about decentralization and participative management.

- The institution has implemented various ICT methodologies in the teaching – learning module.
- The Governing Body is the highest authority and policy making body in the college. The Principal is the Secretary of the Governing Body.
- The college is administrated by the Principal along with the various committees and cells.
- E-governance has been implemented in all areas of operation – viz administration, finance and accounts, admission and support and examination.
- The institution provides various welfare measures for its teaching and non- teaching staff.
- 4 full-time teachers participated in online/face to face FDPs, FIPs orientation programs, Refreshers Course, Short Term Course etc. during the year.
- The institution conducts external audits and internal audits in certain specific areas such as the salary disbursed to the SACTs is done.
- For RUSA grants, all the spendings and its accounts happened through the PFMS portal.
- Funds are generated from collection of students fees, acting as a center of RBU-DDE and NSOU, and hosting competitive examinations of external agencies. Salary grants are received from the State Government.
- The college has institutionalized two practices, as a result of IQAC's quality enhancement initiative- they are incorporation of ICT in teaching learning method and Students' Extension activities like Seminars/Webinar/ Workshops etc.

- Tie-up with nearby hospital is suggested for the benefit of the employees and students.
- Collaborative tie-ups with industries should be more vibrant. Industry people should be engaged frequently to present their views in seminars and talks to make the students aware about the current trends in industry.

- The institution has Solar Energy as an alternate source of energy.
- The institution uses LED lights for controlling energy consumption.
- The college has facilities of solid waste management, liquid waste management, e-waste management, waste recycling system and management of hazardous chemicals.
- The college has pedestrian friendly pathways and also has landscaping with trees and plants.
- The college has Ramp for physically-challenged students
- The college regularly plants trees and medicinal plants in the campus.
- The institution has conducted Green Audit, and Energy Audit during the last five years.
- The college has received recognition for a clean and green campus.
- The institute also organized beyond campus environment promotion activities.
