

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Report on Railing besides the ramps:

Additionally, ramps help comply with laws like the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, which mandates accessible infrastructure. Overall, ramps contribute to a more inclusive and accessible environment, improving the quality of college life and active participation for Divyangjan.

Railings beside ramps are crucial for locomotory-challenged candidates as they provide essential support and stability, helping maintain balance. They enhance safety by reducing fall risks and offering a secure handhold, especially for those with limited mobility. Railings also boost confidence, encouraging independent use of ramps without fear of falling. Compliance with accessibility standards ensures ramps with railings are safe and accessible. Location:

Currently, there are three ramps with railings that are in use:

- 1. A small ramp just on the righthand side of the main entrance
- 2. A ramp ion the rear entrance of Avigyaan Kakshya
- 3. A ramp to reach ground behind the college premise.

Additionally, they facilitate ease of use by assisting in sitting down and standing up, making the toilet more accessible for those with limited mobility. Installing railings is also part of complying with accessibility guidelines and laws, such as the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 in India. These features contribute to creating inclusive environments, ensuring that everyone, regardless of physical ability, can use lavatories and urinals facilities comfortably and safely within the college premise.

Location:

At present, there are three such lavatories cum urinals for Divyang (persons with disabilities) students. They are:

- 1. Two facilities on the frontside of the college building (Besides, common rooms and cheap center for students)
- 2. One facility at the rear end of the building (Behind Avigyaan, besides the rear playground)

Facilities available:


Currently, we have one wheelchair in our college premise.


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Headset and Speaker:

They also help maintain privacy and focus by minimizing background noise and facilitate better communication during online classes and group discussions. Overall, these devices create a more inclusive and supportive learning environment, helping visually challenged students achieve their academic goals more effectively.

Facilities available:

At present, our college has two pairs of headset and speakers dedicated for visually challenged students. Those facilities have been kept in digital library, where visually impaired students often have their audio lectures from different online platform.

Visually-impaired students are benefitted.






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
Braille:
